Our Members

Members of the Analysts' Roundtable, Washington, D.C., Chapter, are drawn from the public and private sectors, including businesses that provide services to government agencies. Individuals gain membership through referrals from current members and/or by invitation. Each company or agency is allotted three slots for members. Two of these slots are for permanent members, who serve as liaisons to their organization. The other slot is a rotating membership that is filled at the discretion of the permanent members, who appoint rotating members as necessary.

A member or potential member must perform the duties of practitioner in the fields of intelligence and/or risk analysis. Although the name of the group is the Analysts' Roundtable, it is not necessary for potential members to have the word "analyst" in their job titles. Instead, it is necessary that they serve as practitioners who either provide, or manage the provision of, analysis in the fields of intelligence, risk, or threat analysis. Membership will generally be restricted to the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia, but exceptions are made on an ad hoc basis, as decided by the Advisory Board.
